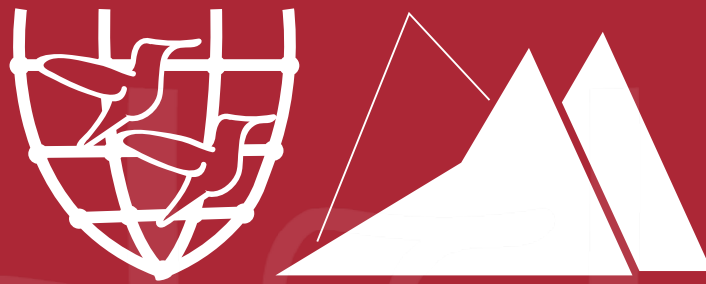

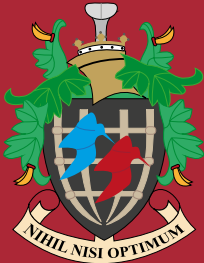

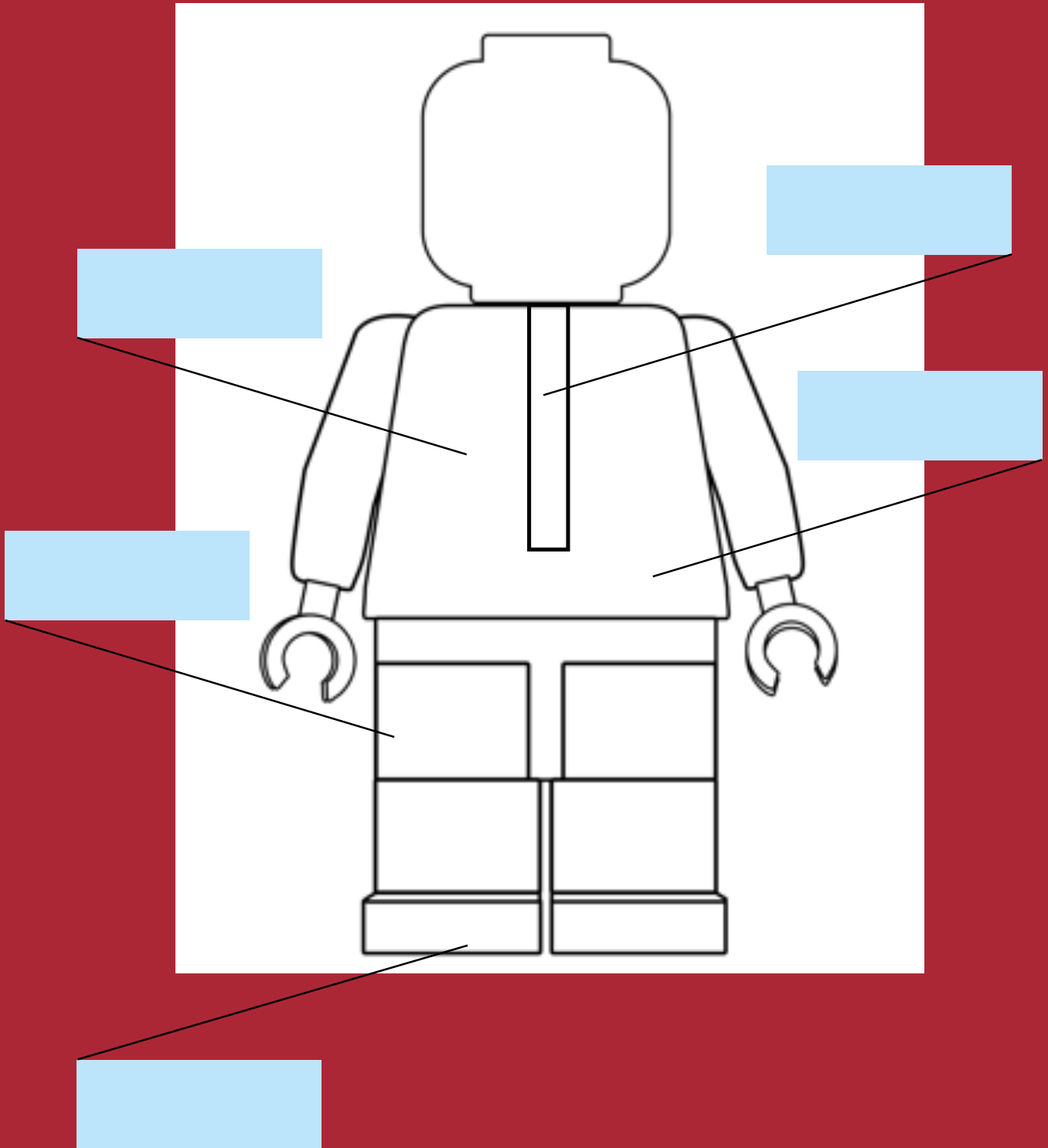

# The House System:

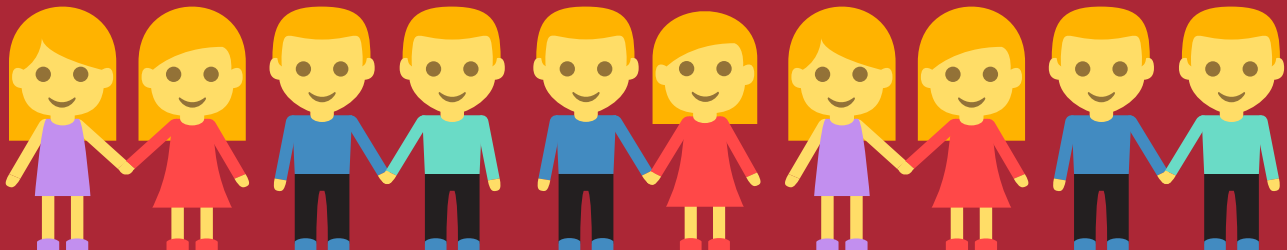
